School Name:	Foothills Elementary	School Year:	2017 - 2018
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<p>Goal: We will improve 3rd grade students' reading proficiency through Tier I and Tier II Reading Interventions.</p> <p>Nebo School Board Goal Connection: <u>Elementary Reading</u>--3rd grade students' reading proficiency will continue to exceed the current state standard and improve annually at the school level according to the DIBELS assessment. <u>Technology</u>--All students will have greater opportunities to learn, think, and create by utilizing provided mobile devices and having lessons that integrate technology.</p>
<p>Action Plan(s):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. We will use the "Early Steps" pullout Tier II program for students in 1st grade and "Nebo Plus" pullout Tier II program for students in 2nd-6th grades who are below grade level in reading. Instructional technicians will be paid with Trustland funds. 2. We will use the Imagine Learning computer tutoring programs (Tier II) for students who are reading below grade level. Funding for the program in grades K-3rd is provided by the state and grades 4th-6th is provided with Trustland Funds. 3. We will open our library once a week for 2 hours every Friday in June and July for families to check out books. The librarian will be paid with Trustland funds. 4. We will hold a monthly Literacy Collaboration where grade level teams will meet with special educators, the intern coach and instructional coach, counselor and psychologist, and the principal to discuss students and their needs. The teams will make decisions on interventions for individual students at Tier I and Tier II before referring to Special Education. Substitute teachers will be provided with Trustland funds for teachers to attend this meeting. 5. We will provide the opportunity for 1st-6th grade students to be introduced to Spanish using an online program provided by Trustland funds. 6. Additional professional development in reading will be given to teachers. Substitute teachers will be provided with Trustland funds. 7. Appropriate technology and supplies may be purchased for instruction and assessment purposes with Trustland funds.

<p>Supporting Professional Development Activities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Literacy Collaboration will be held monthly to discuss individual interventions for students. 2. The Literacy Coach will model, observe and share best practices in Tier I interventions for teachers. 3. District trainers for Nebo Plus and Early Steps will offer additional training for our technicians as needed. 4. The district will provide training in reading through the Coaching Cycle provided by Instructional Coaches. 5. All teachers will meet as Professional Learning Communities and training will be given on the concepts of PLC's and the 6 Non-Negotiables, which are: 1-Team Norms; 2-'I Can' Statements; 3-Common Curriculum; 4-Common Assessments; 5-Data Assessment; 6-SMART Goals. 6. The school facilitator, teachers and technicians will receive Imagine Learning Tier II Intervention training. 7. Training will be given to 3rd-6th grade teachers on the SAGE system. 8. Training will be given to K-3rd grade teachers on DIBELS. 9. Grade level teams will be given a substitute for one day to do curriculum mapping and PLC planning. 10. Gifted Endorsed teachers provide Professional Development training in reading enrichment to other team members.

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<p>Goal: <u>We will improve 4th-6th grade students' proficiency in Mathematics through Tier I and Tier II Math Interventions.</u></p> <p>Nebo Board Goal Connection: <u>Elementary Math</u>--4th-6th grade students' math proficiency will continue to exceed the current state standard and improve annually at the school level according to the SAGE assessment. <u>Technology</u>--All students will have greater opportunities to learn, think, and create by utilizing provided mobile devices and having lessons that integrate technology.</p>
<p>Action Plan(s):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Each grade level will meet once a week in their collaborative Professional Learning Community meetings to create common formative assessments, provide an enriched math curriculum with a scope and sequence to follow, and provide for the needs of the students who master each concept and those who need additional interventions in math. 2. Each grade level will create and implement their own "intervention" plan for students who do not master a given math concept each week through Re-teaching. Instructional technicians will be provided and paid with Trustland funds. <p>We will use the ALEKS for students in 3rd-6th grades, XTRA Math and Success Maker Math Programs to help students in 1st-6th grades. We will provide before or after school math assistance or enrichment for students. Trustland funds will supplement fees and stipends. We will offer training for parents on the ALEKS Math Program within the first 2 months of school. A teacher from each grade level 3rd-6th will receive a stipend for summer planning and development for the parent training. Stipends paid with Trustland funds. We will provide the opportunity for K-6th grade students to participate in the after school Chess Club. Trustland funds will supplement fees and stipends.</p> <p>Additional professional development and PLC collaboration time in math will be given to teachers. Substitute teachers will be provided with Trustland funds.</p> <p>Appropriate technology and supplies may be purchased for instruction and assessment purposes with Trustland funds.</p>

School wide and grade level CMI (Comprehensive Math Instruction) training and support. 3. Training will be given to all faculty members on the concepts of PLC's and the 6 Non-Negotiables, which are: 1-Team Norms; 2-'I Can' Statements; 3-Common Curriculum; 4-Common Assessments; 5-Data Assessment; 6-SMART Goals. 4. Training will be given to 3rd-6th grade teachers on the SAGE system and ALEKS program. 5. Grade level teams will be given a substitute for one day to do curriculum mapping and PLC planning. 6. Gifted Endorsed teachers provide Professional Development training in math enrichment to other team members.

<p>Action Plan(s):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. We will continue to offer a before school orchestra program for 6th grade students. They will perform for parents and students twice per year. 2. We will provide learning experiences in art and music through our Specialties program. 3. Teachers in K-6th grades will participate in professional development in the arts through the Nebo School District GAINS program. 4. We will provide the opportunity for the 4th-6th grade students to participate in the Foothills Choir before school twice weekly. They will perform for parents and students twice per year. Trustland funds will supplement fees and stipends. 5. We will provide the opportunity for 3rd-6th grade students to participate in the Falcon Fiddlers after school program. Trustland funds will supplement fees and stipends as needed. <p>We will provide the opportunity for the 4th-6th grade students to participate in the Foothills Ballroom Dance Program. They will compete against other elementary ballroom dancers. Trustland funds will supplement fees and stipends as needed. Additional professional development in Fine Arts will be offered to teachers. Substitute teachers will be provided with Trustland funds.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 8. Appropriate technology and supplies will be purchased for instructional purposes with Trustland funds.

<p>Action Plan(s):</p>
<p>1. We will create a Foothills PBIS Team that has a diverse representation of school personnel, parents and students.</p>
<p>2. The school PBIS Team will meet monthly to create and implement a plan using the four PBIS Pillars and provide continued support and training for all school personnel. The plan will include a system for informing all parents of expected behaviors. The plan will also include expectations for teachers as they implement the PBIS system in their classrooms with students and a behavior tracking system.</p>
<p>3. We will complete a school self-assessment and use the data to implement the school PBIS system. Self-assessments will be done regularly to determine ongoing training needs. Our goal is to have 75% of school personnel and students self-assess the PBIS system similarly.</p>
<p>4. A stipend for PBIS Team members will be paid with Trustland funds.</p>
<p>5. Additional professional development in PBIS will be given to teachers. Substitute teachers will be provided with Trustland funds.</p>
<p>6. Appropriate technology and supplies will be purchased for implementation, instructional and assessment purposes with Trustland funds.</p>
